Jack's Corner

Put on those bright colors and strike up the band - it's time for the Easter Parade! Spring is here at last, but don't put out those annuals just yet. We still have blackberry and dogwood winters to come. The frost-free date in our area is April 15th, but we have had a freeze after that date from time to time. The safe bet is to plant your annuals toward the end of April and not have to worry about replacing them. When we do have the last gasps of winter, cover your plants with cloths or a protective landscape mesh; just be sure to remove the next morning.

Now is the time to spray lawns and gardens with weed killer as weeds? lawns? are starting to mature. Use a weed killer such as "Over the Top" or "Weed Free Zone;" both will kill weeds and grass in your flower beds but not harm the flowers and shrubs. Use Ortho "Weed B Gone" to eliminate grassy weeds on the lawn. These weed killers are made for use with a garden sprayer, so mix them with water according to the label. After you have sprayed the weeds, apply a layer of mulch to help hold in the moisture and regulate the soil temperature. Mulch also helps keep out the weeds.

After your forsythia, azaleas and camellias have bloomed, give them a pruning if necessary and feed them to make room for your annuals and perennials to take over the show in the garden. Remove faded blooms from daffodils, tulips and hyacinths, but let the foliage die naturally as the latter is where the bulb gets its nutrients for next year's blooms. Feed the spring-flowering bulbs immediately after blooms have faded. Plant your summer bulbs at the end of the month, after the threat of frost has passed.

Sometimes azaleas and camellias will show signs of lace bug and spider mite infestations in the hot months of summer. Prevent this damage by a onetime application of systemic insecticide "Imidacloprid." Simply pour the insecticide around the root system as the flowers fade, spreading the active ingredients throughout the plant tissue where it remains effective throughout the growing season. Always follow the label directions when applying any pesticide.

If you like planting flowers from seed, some easy to grow are marigold, sunflowers, cosmos and zinnias. Be sure to save their seeds after they bloom to plant for next year's flowers.

Mowing season is upon us. Set your mowing blade height to 2 1/2 inches to 3 inches for fescue lawns and 1 1/2 inches to 2 1/2 inches for Bermuda lawns. Feed both types of lawns when the grass is at least 50 percent green.

Don't forget to feed our feathered friends and leave them fresh water. In turn, they will put on quite a show for you. Popular food includes black sunflower seeds and suet cakes which appeals to a wide variety of birds.
