Congratulations, Jeff Craig, PGA of WindStone Golf Club


The Tennessee PGA is proud to recognize PGA Professional Jeff Craig as our 2016 Golf Professional of the Year. Craig serves at the Head Golf Professional at Windstone Golf Club in Ringgold, GA and is a member of the Chattanooga Chapter.

Craig recently served as a Chattanooga Chapter officer from 2009-2015, culminating with a two-year term on the TPGA Board of Directors. While Craig's mentoring and contributions to his fellow Professionals may be his guiding star, his commitment and passion towards junior golf and growing the game will be his legacy. He has served as the Chairman of the Junior Golf Committee for the Tennessee PGA since 2010. During that time the Section's junior golf programming has grown significantly. A record setting 68 teams competed in the 2016 TPGA Junior League Golf program, including three teams from Windstone GC. The team from Chattanooga also advanced to the Junior League Golf state finals under the guidance of Craig. In addition, Craig has served as the Chattanooga District Golf Association Junior Tour Director.

While his knack for junior programming is evident, Craig has also created two team events unique to WindStone: the Gilbert Cup and the Crown Cup, which have been hugely successful for his club and its members. He also built a women's golf clinic program designed for players at every skill level that experienced record participation in 2016. Serving the members at his club is always a top priority as he often takes both the men and women on local golf trips and encourages them to play more golf and interact with fellow members. It doesn't stop with instruction and playing opportunities; Craig also manages the pro shop and handles all merchandising for the club.

The Golf Professional of the Year award is given to a PGA golf professional who has demonstrated outstanding leadership qualities, demonstrated a strong moral character, has maintained a substantial record of service to the Association and game of golf, and is well regarded as a model PGA Professional.

Jack's Corner

Although Spring arrives March 20th, always remember our frost-free date is not until April 15th. Keep that in mind before you have the urge to plant annuals. We will still have damaging cold weather. Use these warmer days ahead to trim trees and spruce up the yard. Plant trees, shrubs and vines to get a head start.

Fertilize your spring blooming bulbs this month. Use one pound of bulb food per 100 square feet of bed space. If you missed the opportunity to prune crepe myrtles in February, you can still prune them this month.

Now is the time to prune and feed roses. Prune hybrid and knockouts to no more than eighteen inches and climbing roses no more than one third of their height. After pruning and fertilizing, be sure to mulch with no more than four inches of mulch which will cut down on weeds and hold in moisture. Prune camellias once they have stopped blooming and feed them with an azalea / camellia food found at local nurseries.

If your perennials have not been blooming as they should for the past year or so now is a good time to divide them. Daylilies, hosta, daisies and cannas can be divided with a shovel or a garden fork. Gently lift and pull apart root clumps. (Some may have to be separated with a knife.) Set the plants back into the soil at their original height, water and mulch.


Buy summer blooming bulbs now while they are plentiful in stock, such as gladiolas, cannas, iris, dahlias and lilies. Make the decision where to plant them, but wait until mid-April to do so.

As the weather warms, you may reseed your fescue lawns or just plant in the bare spots. In early March, apply a pre-emergent for crabgrass and weed control to help control summer weeds. Determine which is more important - reseeding or weed control for your lawn. Remember, once a pre-emergent is used, you can't reseed for at least six weeks.

Sharpen or replace mower blades before beginning the mowing season. This will make a big difference in the way your lawn will look.

Bluebirds are very common in the South and quite beautiful, but they are picky where they choose to nest. Put up bluebird houses now so they are ready when the birds arrive. (I have some nesting now.) Finally, be sure to clean out all feeders and bird baths.
